Reading

In school, reading takes place in a variety of contexts. Children will read aloud with an adult and discuss what they have read. Other reading activities will take place with the whole class or individually. Although children in Year 5 and 6 can read, we really hope that you will help your child by listening to them at home and discussing the content, characters and vocabulary. Research shows that even fluent readers benefit enormously from this. We will continue to check reading records weekly.

If you, a friend or relative are able to spare some time to come in and listen to children read, it really would be appreciated. This could be during an afternoon or for 10 minutes during registration. Even the last 20 minutes of the day, 2 or 3 times a week would make a big difference. Please let us know if you can help in any way.

<u>Spellings</u>

We expect that every child will learn their spellings. These will be given out on a Friday and tested the following week. In order to learn these words, children will need to follow the "Look, Say, Cover, Write, Check" method, writing them out on the list provided in their books.

Multiplication Facts

Quick and accurate recall of tables really does assist maths work. Many children know their tables, but they can keep their skills sharp and improve further by practising on Times Table Rockstars. Children also have access to Sumdog which offers a variety of mathematical challenges.

'SATs'

Year 6 will be taking their 'SATs' tests from 13th - 16th May. Please ensure you do not book holidays during this period. There will be a meeting for parents on Thursday 8th February at 3:30p.m. in Kingfishers to let you know what will be involved.
